Notice is hereby given that pursuant to the Education Ordinance (Cap. 279), a vacancy for Alumni Manager will arise on 1 September 2026.

As the recognised alumni association responsible to conduct election of Alumni Manager, Wah Yan College (Hong Kong) Past Students Association invites you to register as a voter for this election and to nominate a candidate for the election.

To register as a voter, you have to **fill in and submit an electronic registration form** (Refer to the QR code) and your identity will be verified by the School to confirm you are an alumnus. Upon successfully registered, your name will be recorded in our voters' registrar and on the Election Day, you need to appear at the Election Venue in person to collect a ballot to cast your vote.

Please refer to the document "**Procedures for Alumni Manager Election 2026**" (Refer to the QR code), and its 4 annexes which have clearly outlined the relevant details of the Alumni Manager's candidature, nomination, election, duties and the 2026 Election Schedule. The Alumni Manager Nomination Form (Annex 1) must be downloaded, completed, and submitted by email (**chiwilai@hotmail.com**) to the Returning Officer, **Chiwi Lai** ('97), together with a personal information write-up, on or before the closing of the nomination period.

The closing date of voter registration and Alumni Manager nomination is **12 June 2026**. The profile of all eligible candidate(s) for the Election will be posted on the websites of Wah Yan College Hong Kong and Wah Yan (Hong Kong) Past Students Association from 21 June 2026. The Election will be held at the School Campus on **28 June 2026**.

Wah Yan Sailors By Mark Chan ('89)

Wah Yan Sailors (WYS) reached a milestone in 2025 with Team Wah Yan's 5th consecutive participation in the RHKYC Alma Mater Race since its inception, continuing a journey shaped by brotherhood and heritage. Sailing in the waters east of Victoria Harbour, WYS fielded 5 crews among 46 from various institutions, reaffirming a strong and growing presence on the water, supported by a member base of 160 from WYHK and WHK!



A highlight was DBX2, skippered by Thomas Wong (WYHK '65), one of the most senior yet fiercely competitive skippers in the fleet. Aboard his accomplished X4.6 class yacht—winner of major regattas including the China Coast Regatta—Thomas led a crew of Wahyanites, first time Wah Yan sailors, and Sean Law, a Primary 3 student from Pun U Wah Yan Primary School, with generations sailing side by side.

For Thomas, the race was never just about results. After hearing the Wah Yan Sailors' sharing at WYHK's 105th Anniversary Dinner, he stepped forward to train younger sailors, passing on skills, values, and spirit shaped by decades at sea. With brotherhood strengthened on the water, Wah Yan Sailors move forward with confidence as the next generation carries the Wah Yan legacy into the future.

The Wah Yan Games Table Tennis Tournament united 150 alumni and students in a spirited celebration of sport and legacy. The tournament held on 19 April 2026 transformed the School Hall of Wah Yan College, Hong Kong (WYHK) into a lively arena of sport and brotherhood. Nearly 150 players and spectators attended, with 90 participants: 37 from WYHK, 45 from WYK, and 8 from Pun U Wah Yan Primary School (PUWY), forming 20 mixed teams. With a 50/50 alumni–student ratio, students and alumni of different ages and abilities learned from one another, showing that the Wah Yan spirit continues across generations.



The event was attended by distinguished guests, including Fr Alan Wong, Fr Clement Tsui, Ms Cecilia Chow, Dr Davis Chan, and Mr James Chow, as well as ex-Principal Mr George Tam and ex-Sports Master Mr Anthony Ip, who was warmly serenaded with "Happy Birthday". Ho Kai Yiu (Leo), a former Hong Kong representative and Wahyanite, encouraged the participants, while Ho Kwan Kit (Anson), our Guest of Honour and a current Hong Kong team member and PUWY alumnus, thrilled the audience and presented the awards.

More than a competition, the tournament celebrated community and enjoyment. Alumni and students bonded through sport, sharing joy and building connections. Thanks to the generosity of Wahyanites, new sporting resources will be provided for WYHK and WYK, helping future players benefit from improved facilities.

Continuing a long-standing collaboration of over a decade, WYPSA co-organised the annual Interview Workshop with Marymount Secondary School on 21 March 2026 at the MSS campus, equipping students with practical skills and career insights.

Building on joint initiatives such as the Careers Fair, job shadowing, and mentorship programmes, this year's workshop provided a hands-on experience. Over 50 Form 5 students took part in small-group mock interviews led by more than 20 alumni mentors from fields including legal, finance, medicine, real estate, human resources, and information technology. Participants gained valuable exposure to real interview scenarios, constructive feedback, and practical advice, while our collaboration fostered meaningful connections between the two communities.



Principal's Column

Dear Wahyanites,

The school year 2025-26 served as a landmark chapter in the storied history of Wah Yan College, Hong Kong. As we embarked upon our second century, we anchored ourselves to the strategic blueprint of **Mission H3—Heritage, Hope, and Humanity**, the school advancement project that we spent a year developing. This roadmap guided us not only in the development of our physical campus but, more importantly, in the spiritual and human formation of our young gentlemen and the long-term development and positioning of our College.

Guided by the "3 Hs," our advancement project prioritised three key areas: Advancing Teaching & Learning, Enhancing School Administration, and Upgrading Facilities. To support the facility upgrades, we launched a fundraising campaign featuring the "Sports Spectacular Event" on 27 September 2025, organised by our PSA, and the "Walkathon - Strike with Hope in Heritage" (歷·程·華仁行) on 26 October 2025, organised by our PTA.

modernisation of all current classrooms, and the construction of several brand-new classrooms to accommodate our future growth. Another historical milestone was receiving approval from the Education Bureau to expand our student body with an additional Secondary One class starting in the 2026-27 school year, which will enable us to offer a wider array of activities and subject choices for whole-person development.

Our students have also achieved remarkable success on the field and in the concert hall. The Orienteering team achieved another Grand Slam, triumphing in the A, B, and C grade categories. Our B Grade Football and C Grade Basketball teams both secured championships in D2 interschool competitions, earning a D1 spot for our College in both sports for the next school year. Furthermore, our Chinese Orchestra received its first championship in school history at the School Music Festival, while our Informatics Team won numerous Gold Awards in various coding competitions—to name but a few.



Over the summer of 2025, I also travelled to six North American cities—Los Angeles, San Francisco, Vancouver, Toronto, New York, and Boston—to meet our alumni. I felt very blessed to have the chance to reconnect with many of you in person and share the latest developments of the College. The extraordinary support shown by our alumni for their alma mater was truly moving, and your active participation in the fundraising campaign was instrumental to our success. Throughout this year-long effort, the Wah Yan community demonstrated a full spirit of solidarity; the campaign, which concluded in February 2026, successfully raised **HK\$22 million**, significantly surpassing our HK\$20 million target.

Facility upgrades proceeded in tandem with these fundraising efforts. The **Ricci InnoLab**, our first newly renovated venue for the school-based STEAM subject IDEEA, opened its doors on 27 September 2025, coinciding with the celebration of the 70th Anniversary of our campus on Mount Parish. Looking ahead, further upgrades are already in the queue, including the Student Hub, the Sports Centre, the

Looking ahead, we are planning to celebrate the **Centenary of the Society of Jesus in Hong Kong** and the **45th Anniversary of the Fr. Barrett Scholarship** on 18 and 19 December 2026 respectively. We aim to invite all past recipients of the scholarship to return to the school for a celebratory dinner to reconnect and celebrate. We believe several of our newly renovated venues will be ready for an official opening during that weekend before the Christmas break. Please save the dates for these events, and stay tuned for more details.

It has been an absolute privilege to serve as your Chairman over the past year. I would like to extend my deepest gratitude to my fellow council members, advisors, and all alumni who have selflessly dedicated their time, resources, and passion to the Association. This year, we rallied together to support our school's Mission H3 advancement plan, demonstrating the enduring strength of our brotherhood through remarkable generosity and an incredibly vibrant sporting spirit.

Championing Mission H3 and School Advancement

One of our proudest shared achievements this year was standing alongside the school to actively support its facility upgrades campaign. Through initiatives like the WY Sports Spectacular, we gathered tremendous alumni support through both active participation and financial contributions, with many brothers stepping up to contribute generously towards specific sports programmes and room upgrades. Together, these collective efforts will help ensure our campus remains a top-tier environment for generations of students to come.

Uniting through Sports

This year, we transformed our passion for sports into a powerful engine for connection. The WY Sports Spectacular in September brought together almost 200 alumni, students, teachers, and friends across running, sailing, fencing, football, and swimming. The momentum only grew from there. We witnessed the successful kick-off of the Wah Yan Football League in February, and inaugurated the Wah Yan Games with a table tennis tournament that drew 90 enthusiasts spanning generations and skill levels. From alumni joining WYOFF's pacemakers at the Standard Chartered Marathon to our active pickleball, sailing, and rugby interest groups, among others, the energy and camaraderie on the field have been truly inspiring.

Strengthening Professional Ties and Mentorship

Beyond sports, our professional fraternities and mentorship programmes continue to thrive. We successfully hosted massive gatherings, including the Medical and Dental Fraternity dinner with nearly 200 professionals and students, and launched a highly anticipated Innovation Fraternity panel on Stablecoins and Tokenisation at the newly opened Ricci Inno Lab. Our commitment to guiding the next generation remains steadfast. This year's Mentorship Programme featured a Joint-School Interview Workshop with Marymount Secondary School (MSS) supporting over 70 current students and alumni, and a Career Fair where 16 alumni returned to campus to share insights across cutting-edge fields like Artificial Intelligence, Robotics, and Biotechnology.

Looking around Us: Serving Our Community

While we look to the future and expand our reach, I want to highly commend our recent contributions to the Wah Yan Social Service Community, highlighted by the remarkable success of the thousand-people-feast. Initiatives like this are the beating heart of our association. They are a powerful, living demonstration of our shared commitment to being "Men for and with Others," putting our Jesuit values into concrete action to serve and uplift our wider community.

Looking Outward:

Embracing Our Worldwide Brotherhood

Beyond our local community, we are also looking outward. I am proud to share that we are actively re-establishing our direct dialogue with the World Union of Jesuit Alumni (WUJA) Secretariat. By strengthening our direct ties with WUJA, we are plugging back into a powerful, global network. This means more shared resources, a stronger presence on the international stage, and a richer fellowship for all of us.

As part of this global engagement, our brotherhood extends far beyond Hong Kong. We are actively preparing a robust delegation for the WUJA Congress 2026 in Indonesia. Furthermore, we are excited to send our Student Ambassador to the US East Coast this summer to strengthen our bonds with overseas chapters.

Looking Forward: The Legacy of the Late Peter Wong ('58)

I also want to share some incredibly inspiring news regarding the future of our PSA. We have been notified of an upcoming legacy gift of HK\$500,000 from the late Peter Wong ('58), directed straight to the PSA for our own use. Knowing that this support is on the horizon fills us with optimism. This gives us the freedom to look forward, brainstorm, and plan for a new wave of events and initiatives that will energise our community. His legacy is going to spark some truly wonderful happenings for us.
